Titanic 3D "First Class Dinner"

Description: This is a scene from the film Titanic, one of the most well-known and popular English language films of all time. The film is an early 20th century love story about Jack, a poor young man who falls in love with Rose, a well-off young woman aboard the doomed ship The Titanic.

Formulaic expressions:

- On God's good humour going wherever God takes you; not choosing a clear path, but letting fate decide
- Have means to (do something) To have the logistical and financial ability to do something
- From place to place changing location quickly; not staying for long in one house, town, country, etc.
- A lucky hand an idiom in reference to playing cards meaning that a good opportunity arose by chance
- A game of luck a way to express that something happens by chance rather than by skill or strategy
- Rootless existence a transient way of living; not having a permanent home
- Wind up a phrasal verb meaning to arrive at a destination after a lot has happened
- Just (point in time) this indicates that the speaker wants the point in time to appear recent
