## Formulaic expressions:

- A whopping (amount) - a way to emphasise how large of an amount something is
- More bang for the buck - an American expression meaning 'better value for your money'
- Put (something) on trial - to prosecute someone or something and decide whether he/she/it passes or fails. The phrase is in reference to a trial in a court of law.
- A real bargain - A collocation referring to a good item that was cheaply bought
- Not (one's) place to - When someone does not have the authority or status to say/do something
